Dressage Medal Challenge

RULES Open to all adult amateurs and junior riders (professionals are not eligible). Riders will ride the specified dressage test for their level and a Dressage Equitation class. Your percentage scores will be converted to points – i.e. a score of 63.333 % will equal 63.333 points. There is a total of 200 points possible (100 points for the dressage test and 100 points for the equitation class). In addition to the scores earned – at the end of the group equitation class, each rider at that level will be individually asked the same bonus question regarding Dressage worth up to 10 additional bonus points. Points earned from the bonus question will be added to the scores, no points will be taken away for wrong answers. **These two rides will be in addition to any classes regularly ridden.**

BONUS ? Bonus questions will be different for each level. Sample questions – “What does a judge look for in a rider’s posture?” “Please name the parts of the bridle.” “What does it mean to ‘engage’ the hindquarters?” Answers will be awarded a score of 0 – 10 points. Wrong answers will not be counted against you.

AWARDS All divisions will be placed as one class. Placings will be determined by the overall combined scores earned from the dressage test, equitation class, and bonus question (200 points possible). The Champion & Reserve Champion will be awarded champion style neck sash ribbons. The Champion will also receive a “Dressage Medal Champion” fleece cooler and the Reserve Champion will receive a “Dressage Medal Reserve Champion” saddle pad. Medals will be awarded to riders for 1st through 8th place. If entries warrant, the Medal Challenge will be divided into an “Adult Amateur” & “Junior Rider” categories.

Driving Directions: (For specialized direction on how to get from your farm to ours... please MapQuest or YahooMap the show location address.)

From US 131 (North): US 131 South to M-89 at exit 49A (Plainwell). East on M-89 to intersection of M-89 and M-43 (approx. 12 miles). Turn Right/South on M-89. Will come to the main traffic light in Richland - go straight (becomes 32nd Street), first stop sign (approx. 3 miles) turn Left onto “G” Avenue. Turn Right on to, N. 36th St. We are approx. ½ mile on the right side (enter in the 1st driveway).

From I-94 (East or West): I-94 East to Exit 85 (35th St. Galesburg) go North. Turn Right to “H” Avenue. Turn Left/North onto 36th St. We are about half a mile down the road on the left (enter in the 2nd driveway).
